Dear Parents and Guardians,

Thank you for your patience today whilst we have been awaiting direction from the Queensland Government regarding the Greater Brisbane lockdown.

The content of my earlier email remains unchanged; however, we now have the below points to add:

- Students who have visited Greater Brisbane on or since Saturday 20 March must remain at home for the rest of this term. This includes all Year 11 Geography students who recently attended the camp to Tangalooma. Parents are asked to inform the College absentee line as soon as possible if this affects your children.
 - Students in Years 7 to 12 will join their classes via TEAMS where possible and appropriate whilst continuing to work through D2L.
 - Students from Prep to Year 6 will receive information from their classroom teachers.
- In the case where a parent or a member of the household has been in Greater Brisbane on or since March 20 but the children have not, the children can continue to come to school as normal.
- Childcare and OSHC continue operating as normal with the Greater Brisbane rule above applied to students in these programs.
- As always, students who are sick should remain at home and be tested.
- Masks are not compulsory for students whilst they are attending school, however they will need to carry a mask for the time that they are not on campus, for example when travelling on public transport, attending shopping centres, etc. Mask rules have been outlined for all of Queensland. - We are restricting adult visitors to the College grounds for the remainder of this term. However, if you have an appointment or a significant need to attend our campus, we ask that you wear a mask.

- Cross Country has been postponed to Wednesday 21 April.
