


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Our College

Sports Programs

Sport is an important part of the complete educational experience for all Saint Stephen's College students. Through sport, the College encourages all students to strive to achieve their personal best. Saint Stephen's College is committed to providing students with a range of sporting opportunities and a rich history of sporting achievements on an individual and team level.

Athlete wellbeing is paramount in the College that is why Saint Stephen's have invested in highly regarded and specialised coaches to work alongside our young athletes to provide them with tailored training programs and high-level feedback which shapes the athlete's development.

Inter-School and Representative Sport

Saint Stephen's College is a member of the Associated Private Schools (APS), which is a cluster of eight independent schools. The APS Inter-School Sports competition gives students from Year 4 onwards the opportunity to compete in their choice of sport against the other schools in the cluster. The APS is a friendly, yet competitive, Association that maintains the highest standards in sportsmanship, participation, and performance. It also serves as part of the pathway/selection process for students who represent Saint Stephen's College at District, Regional, State and National levels.

Optima Sporting Program

Saint Stephen's College has four Optima Sports Programs: Basketball, Cricket, Soccer and Netball.



These programs have been selected to meet the needs of our students.

At the College, we use a Long-Term Player Development Model (LTDP) and structure our sporting programs around this model to help our student athletes develop and achieve short and long-term goals. The areas of focus in the LTDP Model are speed, strength, stamina, skills, and suppleness. Our program is designed to target these specific areas at specific times to ensure that students can develop their overall athletic ability. Students in each program have one compulsory speed and agility session, one compulsory strength and conditioning session and one compulsory field session in their chosen sport. Each session is for students tailored needs and abilities by our expert staff. Students in the programs will also be exposed to nutrition in sport, high performance training, recovery and injury prevention and management through various experiences.

Theatre programs at Saint Stephen's College offer students a blended approach co-curricular activities like academic drama, musicals, speech and drama, large scale musicals, technical theatre, and music. The College is well regarded for its comprehensive Strings Program that range from our Suzuki Foundation (Years 1 and 2) through to our Chamber of Music Excellence Program in senior years. The Performing Arts Program has won numerous state and national awards for their efforts across ensembles and choirs, instruments, academic music, music, drama, theatre, and productions.

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2023 Snapshot

Saint Stephen's College has a forward focus on continuous improvement in our facilities. In 2023, the newly renovated Central Quad made its debut, having undergone a spectacular transformation at the close of 2022. The grand opening was marked by a delightful Twilight event that brought the entire community together in the first term. A few teaching spaces were quitely redesigned in the Connections areas to welcome an additional Year 7 class for 2024.

The focal point of recent developments is the initiation of the Junior College Hub. This hub boasts tinkering spaces, music rooms, collaborative areas, Junior Administration offices, and a Uniform Shop. The revitalization of the canteen area presents an exciting prospect, closely connected to the central courtyard, fostering unity among the entire school community from Prep to Year 12 within this space. The 2023 College student leadership team brought a heartfelt and strong student voice to the College this year. They have set a quality standard for communication and leadership that will give confidence and positivity to those now taking us into a new look 2024 based on the theme of Diversity. The students in our Junior College who fulfil leadership roles also stepped up to make their programs exciting and a real influence for kindness, care and consideration across the whole College. 2023 was a very successful sporting year at the College both on and off the field. This year saw the consolidation of our four Optima Sporting Programs: Basketball, Cricket, Netball and Soccer. Success in these programs is building particularly within our Junior College. These students are showing that the future is bright. The College won 10 APS sports premierships a significant increase from four in 2022, and a real highlight was the winning of the Senior School Athletics Percentage trophy for APS and numerous external trophies. Saint Stephen's College successfully expanded the range of extracurricular sessions, offering additional activities tailored for Prep to Year 3 students. The College community has shown remarkable support for these sessions, leading to an impressive turnout of over 50 students in both the Prep to Year 3 Runners Club and Gymnastics. Additionally, the Runners Club sessions for Years 4 to 12 have attracted over 250 students throughout the year. The Dare 2 Dance College Dance program continues to thrive, with programs operating at full capacity and notable victories at Eisteddfod, along with valuable opportunities in national dance aerobics.

Chair Report

International Education

In 2023, Saint Stephen's College commenced the academic year with an enrolment of 66 international students, concluding the year with a total of 91. These students originated from diverse countries, including the People's Republic of China, Fiji, Hong Kong (SAR of China), Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Papua New Guinea, Russia, Taiwan, Thailand, USA, and Vietnam.

Due to the absence of border restrictions, the demand for international student admissions exceeded the available positions within the College. Consequently, an International Student Waiting Pool was established for the first time in its history. Throughout the majority of the year, both the Junior and Senior College experienced full enrolment in the reinstated Intensive English programs.

The resumption of short-stay programs and study tours facilitated the hosting of over 200 students throughout the year. In collaboration with Tourism and Events Queensland and Banora International Group, Saint Stephen's College played a key role in hosting a group of principals from Japanese schools. The purpose of their visit was to explore educational opportunities in Queensland. Recognised as a leading institution in international education, the College was chosen to showcase its offerings to the visiting principals. This visit not only has the potential to foster school-to-school cultural exchanges but is also instrumental in strengthening the relationship between Saint Stephen's College and Tourism and Events Queensland.

Gap Program

Having successfully reached its two-year milestone, the Gap Program has expanded beyond its initial scope to encompass non-teaching aspects of the College's operations. Positive feedback from College Staff underscores unanimous support for the program's continuation (100%), with 87% of surveyed staff expressing a desire for its further expansion. Preliminary investigations into this expansion have been initiated for the years 2024 and beyond.

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

From teaching approaches to learning spaces and curriculum design, the report looks at schools reshaping the future of education. By the end of the judging process, the entries were narrowed down to 35 of the country's most forward-thinking schools, which make up The Educator's 5-Star Innovative Schools 2023 list. Saint Stephen's College retained its position as a 5-Star Innovative Schools 2023.




